

Thinking of Sustainability in Arts and Culture

Sustainability has become a common word in our global age. In this symposium, six experts from Japan and Thailand will present on the same topic of "sustainability" from various perspectives, such as, arts management, ethnomusicology, outdoor education, film, visual arts, popular culture, and music education. Together with you, we will consider how much culture and arts could give soft but big impacts on our society.



He established Sapporo Artist in Residence (S-AIR) in 1999, which was later registered as an official non-profit organization in 2005. S-AIR has hosted 105 international artists from 37 countries and regions. In 2014, he became a professor at Hokkaido University of Education, Iwamizawa, and has been leading the Art project Lab. He has organized various art projects such as "SNOWSCAPE MOERE"

She is a professor of Chulalongkorn University, Thailand. she is currently a dean of the Faculty of Fine and Applied arts of CU.
